William De Jeanne arrived in New Haven Connecticut presumably under his assumed name, William Jayne in 1670. He may have selected New Haven because his Uncle William had been an early settler there in 1634. His uncle had already move to Northfield, Massachusetts. On June 10, 1675 when William was 58, he married his second wife, Anna Biggs, age 22, in New Haven, Connecticut. They then moved to Brookhaven, Long Island June 11, 1676. The oldest recorded deed known for the area is dated May 19, 1675 and recorded May 22, 1675, conveying to William Jayne and Thomas Helme a house and land at Setauket, Long Island. Born about 1653, Anna died before 1683 when she was 30.

In 1683 when William was 65, he married his third wife, Anne Jennings, daughter of John Jennings and Anne Youngs. Anne was born about 1653 and died before 1694 when she was 41. They had the following children:

In 1694 when William was 76, he married his fourth wife, Mehitable Jenkins, in Setauket, Long Island, New York. They had one child:

William Jayne's trade was cooperage. He elected to settle in a natural hollow in the hills two or three miles back from the water or so from the village green. Here he built a substantial house facing south with a hill rolling up to its back to cut off the cold north winds. On his left were his fields, to his right were his orchards. The walls of the house were shingled, nailed on with hand-hewn nails. It was what is known as a double house. That is with an entrance hall in the middle with rooms on either side. At the rear an ample lean to was built which housed the cooling domain. A large chimney ran up the middle of the house so that each room on the ground floor had its fireplace. On the second floor there were three bedrooms and a storage place.

William Jayne joined a group of other men to purchase Brookhaven, Long Island from the Indians and to make an application for a grant from the Crown. The names in the deed from Setauket of the Nassau Indians are the same as in the Crown grant: Nathaniel Brewster, Nathaniel Woodhull, William Jayne, Ebenezer Hulse, etc. The town was organized in 1678. Later William and Annie conveyed several parcels of property at Setauket, Long Island to different parties. William

Jayne was made one of the trustees of the town and remained a trustee until 1699 when his son William Jayne Jr. was elected constable and collector.

On October 12, 1701, William was one of the Trustees of the town of Brookhaven. By 1708 he had moved to Setauket, Long Island where he died March 24, 1714 at the age of 96 and was buried in the old Presbyterian cemetery at Setauket where his tombstone is still standing with this inscription:

Here lies ye body of William Jayne
Born at Bristol, England
January 25th, 1618
Died March 24th, 1714
A.E. 96

It is the oldest tombstone in the ancient burial place at Setauket, Long Island. When William Jayne died in 1714, he left behind six sons and two daughters, and these six sons had 21 sons.

Will dated 16 Mar 1684/85. Proved 3 May 1695. Lists wife Sarah; eldest son John, and sons Timothy and Daniel; grandchildren Daniel and Abigail Burr.

William Jayne, II lived on Long Island until sometime after 1726 when he sold his homeplace on Long Island to his brother, Matthias Jayne, and removed to Florida, Orange County, New York. "Nordecia Lester of Hemstead, L. I. in Queens County, Merchant, and Augustus Oldfield of -the same place, sell to William Jayne Jr. of Brookhaven, a tract of land at a place called Florida in the Patent of Wawayanda in Orange County, 150 acres, being part of 300 acres laid out to Christian Suldinois, deceased-price 92 pounds, 10 S-Sept. 3, 1735." (From the Independent Republic (newspaper).William

succeeded his-father, William 1, as trustee of Brookhaven in 1709 and served until 1726 or later. In 1719, William Jayne 11 resigned his seat in the Presbyterian meeting house, along with others, as a protest measure.

William III signed the Loyalty Pledge 1777, and had five sons in the Revolutionary War. He removed to Pennsylvania and settled in Monroe County. In the History of Wayne, Pike and Monroe Counties, Pennsylvania by Matthews, page 1106, we find: "It is not possible to determine with certainty who was the first settler in Middle Smithfield (Pa.) though among the earliest were William and Isaac Jayne, two brothers, who made the township their residence after having taken up several large tracts of land."

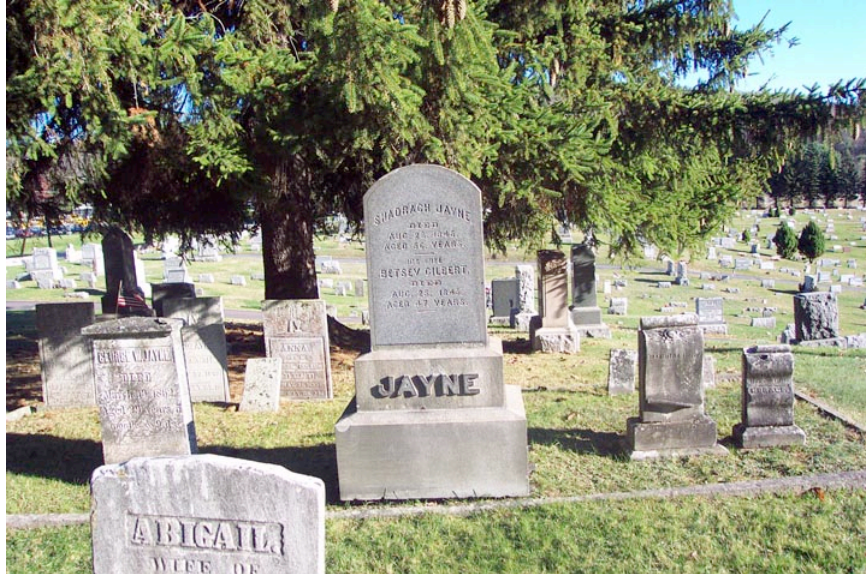

The son Eli W. Jaynes died in the Village of Painted Post on Sept. 13, 1907 aged 82 years 10 months. Only one of his siblings was alive at that time, his brother Anthony D., who was living in Utica. Anthony D. Jaynes became the administrator and tried to identify the other heirs of his brother. He was able to find the names of many nieces, nephews, grandnieces, and grandnephews, but did not know all of their first or last names, and in several cases he did not know where some of these heirs were living. The obituary of Eli Jaynes states that he was one of 19 children and his death affidavit identifies his parents as Jesse Jaynes and Mary Rockwell.



The gravestone of Jesse Jaynes gives his age at the time of death as 70 years 7 months. There are two other nearby stones:

Anthony Jaynes, son of Jesse & Mary Jaynes, died Dec. 15, 1861, aged 19 yrs. 11 mos.

Adelia Jaynes Huffman, granddaughter of Jesse & Mary Jaynes 1868-1934.

This Anthony Jaynes is a puzzle, since Eli W. Jaynes was survived by a brother Anthony D. Jaynes, who in 1907 was living in Utica, NY.

The earliest date that I can find for Jesse Jaynes' residence in the Hornby area is Oct. 1, 1847 when he purchased two tracts of land containing 13 acres and 25 acres in the town of Orange which adjoins Hornby on the north. He bought the land from William Hornby of London. On Oct. 9, 1850 Jesse and Lydia were residing in Hornby when they sold the 25 acre tract to Norman Putnam of Orange, and they were still in Hornby on Mar. 8, 1851 when they sold the other 13 acres to Asa L. Rockwell of Orange. The Town of Orange is now a part of Schuyler County and the three deeds were transcribed from Steuben Co. to Schuyler Co. They may be found in Vol. 7 p. 87, Vol. 8 p. 37, and Vol. 8 p. 124 of Schuyler Co. deeds.
